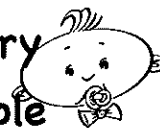

Today marks the beginning of Holy Week, commemorating Jesus' entry into Jerusalem, and falls one week before Easter Sunday, which is on April 5, 2026.

We celebrate Jesus's entry into Jerusalem by saying "Hosanna!", "Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord!", or simply "Happy Palm Sunday!". It marks the start of Holy Week with greetings focused on praise, welcoming Jesus, and reflecting on his journey to the cross.

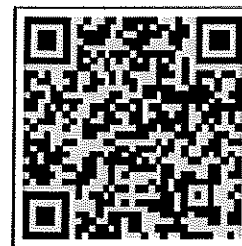

Pastor Mark's Remarks for March 2026

"Faith is about Relationship and Purpose, not just Destination"

Genesis 12:1-4 - Now the Lord had said to Abram:

*"Get out of your country,
From your family and from your father's house,
To a land that I will show you.*

*² I will make you a great nation; I will bless you
And make your name great; and you shall be a
blessing.*

*³ I will bless those who bless you, and I will curse him
who curses you;
And in you all the families of the earth shall
be blessed."*

*⁴ So Abram departed as the Lord had spoken to him,
and Lot went with him.*

So often we talk about faith as our access point to salvation. It is, but it is meant to be an access point to much more than that. Faith is meant to bring us into a greater experience of God's presence and purposes now and not just qualify us to go to heaven when we die.

Because Abraham was a man of faith, God chose him to model what ought to be normal life in God's Kingdom. He was a friend of God, and he would be blessed to be a blessing to his generation and many generations to come because of his faith.

When faith remains a private thing which I depend on for my own salvation without becoming something acted out in my life for the sake of glorifying God and blessing others, it misses out on much of what it is intended to do. Abraham acted on his faith and allowed God to lead him into his purpose. It is being willing to take the risk of acting on his faith which led him into both a greater intimacy with God and a greater impact in the world.

As I get older, I am less satisfied with my faith getting me to heaven and hungrier to allow it to lead me into risks and adventures where I will get to know aspects of God I would otherwise never know and be part of spreading God's Kingdom in the world in ways I would otherwise never imagine by keeping my faith intellectual rather than experiential.

Father may my faith be more than just an intellectual exercise that gets me to heaven when I die. May it be an invitation to risk and adventure which will lead me to greater intimacy with you and greater participation in what is in the world. AMEN

LifeWise Bible Classes in Yukon and Mustang Schools

Pastor Mark is part of a group working to provide school-day, released-time, off-site Bible classes in Yukon and Mustang schools. It is through an Ohio-based group called LifeWise which has started over 1000 such programs in about 35 states so far. We have hired a director in Yukon and are working to find one in Mustang. If you want to make a memorial donation to honor Penny, please consider the following option approved by the family.

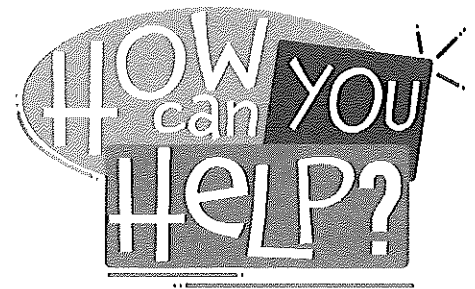


Lori B has moved to a different office. Her old office is being totally renovated to make a comfortable, inviting room for the teens to have Sunday School and social events inside the building.

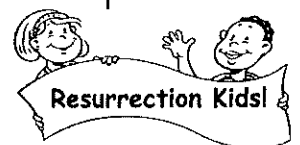
