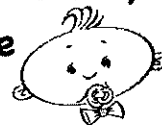

Red is the color used on Pentecost Sunday. On this day we remember the power and fire of the Holy Spirit, "the Lord and Giver of Life." The color red communicates the motif of strength – the strength and power the Holy Spirit gives in order for God's people to call on the name of Jesus Christ and share that powerful name with others.

Pentecost begins fifty days after Easter. The season of Pentecost may last from 22 to 28 Sundays. **Green** is the appointed color for all but a few of these Sundays. The Sundays following Pentecost are called the season of the "green meadow," as these Sundays also emphasize the subject of growth.

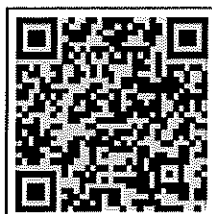

Pastor Mark's Remarks – July 2026***"Requirement to be Blessed is a
Who not a what"***

*"Blessed are the poor in spirit,
for theirs is the kingdom of heaven."*
Matthew 5:3

True blessing is not about having the right things, but about having the right relationships.

In Matthew 5, Jesus paints a picture of what the kingdom of heaven he is building on earth is to look like. As he teaches his disciples, he repeatedly uses the Greek word "makarios" to describe what a blessed life looks like in his kingdom.

The Greeks understood that word to mean having everything you need in life so that you have no need to look anywhere else. They called Cyprus the "Makarios Island" because everything one needed for a good life could be found on the island, so there would never be a need to go anywhere else.

Their understanding was that if you just had everything you need, you would be immune from worry or fear. If I have a big savings account, I am ready for any unexpected expense. If I have two cars, I am ready if one fails. If I have a good pension, I will never need to worry about money again.

Yet Jesus spoke to people who were nowhere near qualifying for that definition of being blessed. He spoke of those who didn't have all they needed as being the ones who were truly blessed. Why?

It is possible to have all the things, but be the most lonely, empty person on the planet. Jesus suggests that true blessedness is not based on having the "whats" in life, but by having true connection with the right "whos."

When we don't have all the "whats" the secret to true blessing is to be with those who do. It is by not being self-sufficient we learn to depend on God and community.

If I were given the option between living alone on an island where I would never lack in anything, or living in a small apartment, learning to trust God each day and intimately connected in community, I would take option 2 any day of the week.

Jesus, remind me that true blessing is not an abundance of "whats" but true connection with the right "whos." May I know that when I have you and Christian community, I will never need to worry about the "whats."

Men's Group – Saturday, July 18 at 8:30am

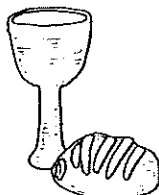

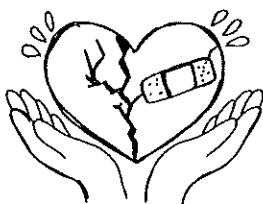

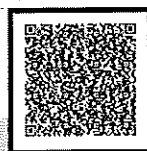
