

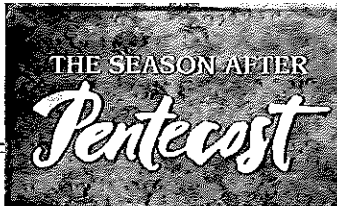

Red is the color used on Pentecost Sunday. On this day we remember the power and fire of the Holy Spirit, "the Lord and Giver of Life." The color red communicates the motif of strength – the strength and power the Holy Spirit gives in order for God's people to call on the name of Jesus Christ and share that powerful name with others.

Pentecost begins fifty days after Easter. The season of Pentecost may last from 22 to 28 Sundays. **Green** is the appointed color for all but a few of these Sundays. The Sundays following Pentecost are called the season of the "green meadow," as these Sundays also emphasize the subject of growth.



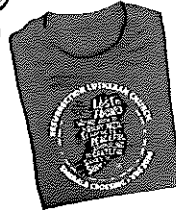

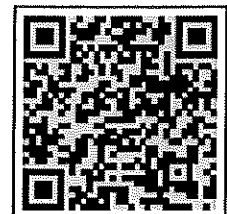

Pastor Mark's Remarks – June 2026

***"Jesus chose us to Send.
us not to Evacuate us"***

But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." Acts 1:8

We just celebrated Pentecost Sunday where we remembered the pouring out of the Holy Spirit 2000 years ago in Jerusalem. The plans Jesus had for those he had saved through his death and resurrection several weeks earlier were not to airlift his followers out of the world to safety, but rather to empower them and send them into the world to lay down their lives in love and service to others.

Religion often has no bigger goal than to get airlifted out of sin, suffering and death. The Kingdom of God which Jesus came to proclaim and embody, is more interested in being sent into a world of sin, suffering and death to bring forgiveness, healing and life than in being airlifted out.

I have often referred to the book *Streams of Living Water* by Richard Foster in my sermons. In that book, Foster refers to six different streams of the Christian church. When those streams run separately, they have very little impact on the topography of faith in the world. When they ***flow together***, they

change the spiritual topography deeply and widely.

Yet, just knowing what the various streams are does not ensure that the gifts of those streams are accomplishing what they were intended for. Sometimes, the problem is that the stream is running the wrong direction. ***A stream that is meant to flow into the world to bring life and refreshing instead flows out of the world to save itself.***

Examples:

Contemplative/Prayer stream – Focus all prayer on convincing God to give me what I want rather than asking God to give me what he wants me to have to be a blessing to others.

Holiness stream – Focus on being a nice, upstanding person to impress God and other people rather than asking God to heal my character defects so I can better love and serve others.

Charismatic stream – Focus on mountaintop experiences to feel better about myself rather than asking for spiritual gifts, love and courage to give people encounters with God's love and power in the valley.

Social Justice stream – Do nice things for the people it is fashionable to advocate for so I can impress others and feel morally superior to those who are not as loving as me rather than loving others even when it isn't fashionable and when I will receive no accolades.



Evangelical stream – Master the Bible for my own pride and agenda rather than allow the Bible to master me and lead me into God’s agenda for me to bless others.

Incarnational/Sacramental stream – I do the sacraments and rituals of the church right so I can score points with God rather than giving God access to work through my weakness and vulnerability to be a contact point for others to experience God through me.

The difference between a religious life and a Kingdom life is which direction my life flows. Is my life flowing out of the world to save myself or flowing from the grace of God into the world to be a blessing to others.

Worship in June (and beyond): In June we move fully into the season of Pentecost, which is the long season which will take us all the way until the end of November. Pastor Mark will be preaching based on the assigned lectionary readings and will use the same liturgical setting from the Green Book which we have been using (with minor changes for the new season).

One thing we want to do this summer is incorporate some of people’s favorite

hymns. They don’t even have to fit the theme of the day. We just want to enjoy some of the hymns people really enjoy. Let Pastor Mark know if you have favorite hymns you want us to sing.



Worship Planning for July. We will meet at 9am on Sunday, June 7 to plan worship and music for July. We would love to have anyone who wants to have input join us at that meeting.

Possible Sermon Series and Simplified Service coming in July or August

Pastor Mark is looking at doing a sermon series based on the book *The War of Worldviews: Choosing Connection in a Culture of Separation* by Jamie Winship. Often the problem isn’t that the church has bad theology, it’s just we are operating no differently than the world around us and thus not achieving any better results. What if the operating system is what really needs to be changed?

We will be talking at our Worship Planning meeting about doing a simplified worship service starting later in the summer. There are some simple services such as Service of the Word or Morning Prayer that might be a good change of pace for a while. Let Pastor Mark know if you have any questions or thoughts regarding this, or come to the meeting on June 7.

Wednesday Dinner and Bible study continue this summer – Dinner at 6:30/Bible study at 7:00

We will finish our study on prayer on Wednesday, June 10 and will start another study for the summer. One suggestion is to do a study on Revelation using the book *Life Lessons from Revelation* by Max Lucado. Stay tuned for more information as plans are finalized.

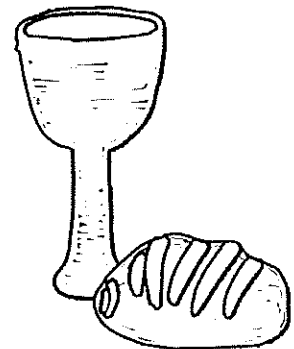

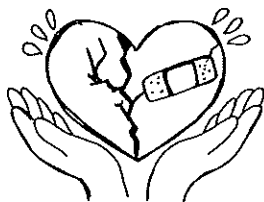

All 5th–12th graders are invited and encouraged to join us for an overnight youth retreat centered on the theme of Freedom — and what makes the Lutheran understanding of freedom unique. Together we'll explore questions like: What are we freed from? What are we freed for? And how does God call us to use our freedom in service to our neighbors and the world? Through conversation, games, worship, movement activities, and fellowship, we'll dive into topics like Bondage of the Will and Luther's The Freedom of a Christian in ways that are engaging, thoughtful, and fun.

We'll kick things off at 2:00 p.m. with outdoor movement and water activities to help everyone settle in after traveling, so students may want to bring a towel and an extra change of clothes. Sleeping arrangements will be flexible, with space for family groups in classrooms or larger group sleeping areas in the fellowship hall. Our retreat will conclude with lunch and conversation alongside the people of Trinity OKC as we reflect together on what we've learned and how we are called to live out our freedom in Christ.

Parents are welcome to attend as well; all adults participating must have a current background check on file with the synod office*.
