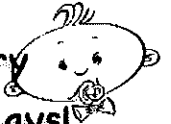
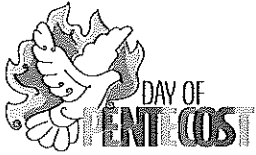

Red is the color used on Pentecost Sunday. On this day we remember the power and fire of the Holy Spirit, "the Lord and Giver of Life." The color red communicates the motif of strength – the strength and power the Holy Spirit gives in order for God's people to call on the name of Jesus Christ and share that powerful name with others.

Pentecost begins fifty days after Easter. The season of Pentecost may last from 22 to 28 Sundays. Green is the appointed color for all but a few of these Sundays. The Sundays following Pentecost are called the season of the "green meadow," as these Sundays also emphasize the subject of growth.



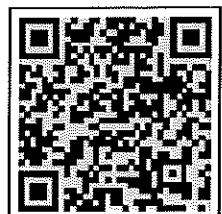

**Pastor Mark's Remarks for May 2026 –
"Community of the Shepherd"**

⁴² [The baptized] devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers.

⁴³ Awe came upon everyone because many wonders and signs were being done through the apostles. ⁴⁴ All who believed were together and had all things in common; ⁴⁵ they would sell their possessions and goods and distribute the proceeds to all, as any had need. ⁴⁶ Day by day, as they spent much time together in the temple, they broke bread at home and ate their food with glad and generous hearts, ⁴⁷ praising God and having the goodwill of all the people. And day by day the Lord added to their number those who were being saved.

When we live in the community of Jesus, the Good Shepherd, there are certain characteristics that will define our community. The agenda of the Enemy is to create a society in which the opposite of each of these is true.

Characteristics of the Community of the Good Shepherd:

1. You are known by name
2. You learn how to hear the Shepherd's voice
3. You have a safe place to go in and rest
4. There is a community of healing
5. People will come find you if you wander away
6. You discover your identity and purpose

7. You are encouraged to live out your identity and purpose
8. People do life together
9. People worship together
10. People pray together
11. Nobody is in need
12. Miracles happen regularly
13. Others see the community and want it for themselves



The Enemy hates this community and will do all he can to destroy it and lead people away from from it.

A disconnected, broken, hopeless world, needs more than Christians going to heaven when they die. It needs an ever-expanding Community of the Good Shepherd to bring the culture of Heaven to earth.

Wednesday Dinner and Bible study from now until June 10 – Study Topic: Prayer

We are beginning a new study on Prayer using "The Prayer Course" which is based on Pete Greig's book *How to Pray: a simple guide for normal people*. If you want to grow in your ability to hear God's voice and see God work more fully in and through your life, this course is for you.

Season of Easter: Easter Sunday through Pentecost (May 24)

Easter is not just a day, but a whole season of learning how the resurrection of Jesus changes everything. It focuses on the 40 days Jesus appeared after his resurrection and before his ascension, and then the 10 days Jesus' followers prayed in the upper room after the ascension before the Holy Spirit was poured out on Pentecost.

If Jesus is alive, we don't focus on remembering what he did in the past, but on hearing him and being in relationship with him now. That is why we are studying prayer for Wednesday Bible study and why we will be doing a Prayer Vigil from Ascension Day (May 14) through Pentecost Sunday (May 24).

Prayer Vigil – Ascension (May 14) to Pentecost (May 24)

The ascended Jesus told his disciples (who had spent three years with him) that they were not ready to enter into all God had for them just based on their experience. They needed more. They needed the Holy Spirit living in and working through them for what would come next. They prayed for 10 days after his ascension until the Holy Spirit was poured out and changed everything.

It is still the case we will not be equipped to do all God has called us to do based on our human knowledge and experience. We need the fullness and power of the Holy Spirit at work in our lives.

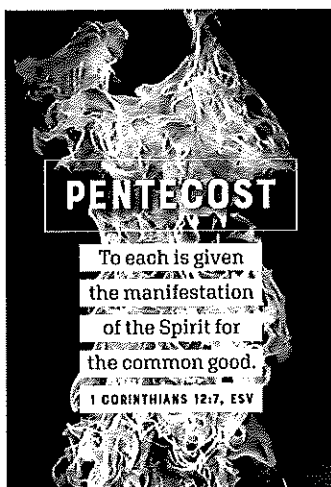
This year, we will be doing a prayer vigil from May 14 to 24 where we hope to get most if not all our congregation being intentional in prayer. What will participating in this look like?



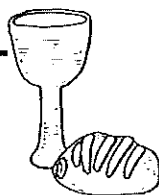
"And you will see the Son of Man sitting at the right hand of the Mighty One ..."

1. **Pray for the Holy Spirit** to fill you, empower you and give you a greater experience of God's presence at least once a day. Suggestion – pray at the time corresponding to your birthday – you can do it AM and/or PM. (example – my birthday is May 19, so I will set my phone to remind me at 5:19 each day to pray).
2. **Practice a new Prayer Discipline each day.** Suggestion – **to the Examen** (from St Ignatius of Loyola) each night before bed. Format for the Examen:
 - Step 1: Sit comfortably and take a deep breath. Become aware of God's presence with you.
 - Step 2: Thank God for everything from today – even the little things. What are you grateful for now?
 - Step 3: When you are ready, review your day. Notice when your heart felt alive or peaceful, and when it felt heavy or restless. Which moment stands out?
 - Step 4: Pick one of those moments and talk with God about it like you are chatting with a friend.
 - Step 5: Look at tomorrow and ask God for whatever you need to face it well.

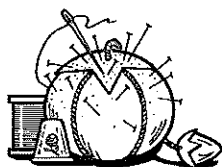

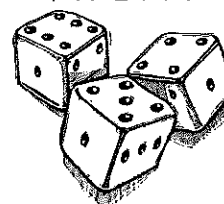

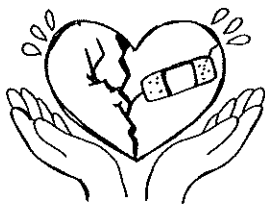
